Langston Hughes would often go to jazz night clubs to write what turned out to be timeless poetry. His aim was to transmit in words what he heard in the sounds and rhythms of jazz. His was an uncommon eye into the African American experience, but beyond that, into life itself. The results led him to be known as the Black poet laureate of the twentieth century. A look at the life, the spirituality, and the poetry, with jazz backdrop, of Langston Hughes.

She is the author of seventeen books on issues concerning environmental and natural resources policy, including **RECYCLING LAND**, **MODERN ENVIRONMENTAL LAW** and **A COMPLETE GUIDE TO ENVIRONMENTAL AUDITS**.

She is a frequent speaker at conferences and seminars and is widely published in scholarly journals. Her primary research examines environmental risk assessment, environmental management systems, brownfields redevelopment and environmental, health and safety issues concerning shale gas extraction.
