First UU has taken to heart the Bible saying "Faith without works is dead" (James 2:26). We are learning to live our faith through works via the HUUB, which opens our buildings to our Orange neighbors. But to sustain that effort, we know we need more FAITH. In these challenging times we turn to wise people who can articulate FAITH and describe how their faith supports their WORKS. Join us for a six-part series called "FAITH+WORKS" on occasional Sunday evenings for this church year. Invited guests speakers will tell us of how their faith motivates their work, and how we can do the same. Please join us on the dates below.

- 15 Jan *The Red Road* Dr. Margaux Simmons Leader - Mindy Thompson Fullilove, Musician- Dr. Margaux Simmons**

This musician, composer, music theorist, and teacher will share her take on FAITH+WORKS. Margaux will draw connects to her work with some of her Lakota Sioux family members who are currently on the front lines as Water Protectors, opposing the Dakota Access Pipeline (DAPL) at Standing Rock.

Margaux Simmons is a composer, flutist, performer, teacher and activist. She earned a BA in music performance from Antioch College in Yellow Springs, OH, and an M.A. and PH. D in music composition from the University of California at San Diego. She has performed extensively in Ohio and throughout Europe and recorded three albums with the performance ensemble, The Pyramids. Margaux has also traveled, studied and performed music throughout Africa, Canada and NYC. She taught music theory, music composition and music improvisation at Hampshire College from 1987 to 2007. Margaux also worked as a curator for The Museum at Wounded Knee, Wounded Knee, SD, on the Pine Ridge Sioux Reservation from 2007 to 2010. Currently, she teaches music theory at the University of Orange, and music instruments at the Calderone School of Music in East Hanover and Springfield, NJ, and is currently working with the University of Orange to organize the Music City Festival for June 2017.

Michael will talk some, and read some from his books - now 29 published, mostly poetry, including a few that have won awards and the two latest SWING THEORY and THE VILLAGE SONNETS - on how he had a spiritual awakening while living and working in Hollywood (acting on TV, NYPD BLUE, DEADWOOD, etc. and writing for and acting in movies DRUGSTORE COWBOY, WHITE FANG, etc.), and more.

Michael Lally is poet and the author of 29 books of poetry. Part of the New York School of poetry, Michael counts among his major influences the poets Frank O'Hara and William Carlos Williams, as well as writer William Saroyan. Born in Orange in 1942 and raised in South Orange, he joined the United States Air Force in 1962, where he spent more than four years as an enlisted man, and later used the G.I. Bill to attend the University of Iowa Writers' Workshop. In 1972 he wrote the autobiographical "South Orange Sonnets" which received a New York Poetry Center Discovery Award. With a move to Los Angeles in 1982, Michael began working as an actor in movies and TV (as Michael David Lally), mostly as a bad guy and the occasional good guy, while his writing found its way into several movies.



2016 Canvass Wrap-Up & Membership Review

The Church concluded its 2016 Canvass short of its stated goal of \$13000. As of 22 December 2016, we received signed pledge cards from 10 households totaling \$10,950 of which \$6050 have already been given. Please remember that pledge cards and payments received are for the current fiscal year. In addition, we had five Friends pledge during the Canvass for another \$1225 and made donations totaling \$925. Together, the Canvass received pledges amounting to \$12,175 (93.65%) and donations totaling \$6975. We thank all who participated for your generosity. Donation notices for the calendar year 2016 will be sent out shortly.

The conclusion of the Canvass gives the Board of Trustees the opportunity to review and update the church's Membership Roster. This is done to prepare for the congregational certification to the UUA that is due by 1 February 2017. The Board Secretary, in coordination with the Treasurer, will determine which Members have remained active in the church over that past year. Notice of any change of status will be sent to Members deemed inactive with an explanation about how to re-activate their membership if desired. Membership notices will be sent out after the Board meeting of Monday, 23 January 2017.

However, you don't have to wait until notices arrive. You can still make a pledge and donation. We encourage Members and Friends, old and new, near and far - that if this spiritual community has meant anything to you, has given you spiritual, emotional and intellectual sustenance through the years that has shaped your lives and hearts - to show your gratitude by pledging your support for First UU's continued existence. HUUB Matching Campaign A Success

This project will only be funded if at least \$5,000 is pledged by December 26, 2016.

On 26 December 2016, the HUUB had a great Christmas present when it successfully reached and surpassed its goal in its matching campaign. The final tally recorded 37 donations amounting to \$5800 toward the HUUB's mission of "creat[ing] a public space to advance the UU values of strengthening democracy, building community, and respecting the worth and dignity of every person. We are opening the church's doors as a resource for individuals, groups, organizations, and institutions in Orange to work together to make it a healthier, happier, and more just city – living the pursuit of beloved community." The HUUB now qualifies, and will receive, an additional \$5000 from the Unitarian Universalist Fund Program's Fund for Social Responsibility. "We were thrilled to get funding from the UUA," said First UU President and member of the HUUB Board Mindy Fullilove. "This is a great outcome, and earns us the match [ing grant] from UUA. Thanks to all!" In all, 37 donors contributed in amounts ranging from \$25 to \$1000 with nearly \$2000 gained from a dozen contributors in the last 10 days of the campaign. "Awesome" said longtime church member and First UU Board Trustee Darcy Hall. "Thank you to all who have helped us get here," said HUUB Managing Director Charlie Wirene. "The more we raise, the more we can ask for in the future! Onwards!" Figures have not been confirmed, but should bring the total income for the HUUB at about \$25,000 for this fiscal year so far.




ABOUT THE CHURCH


